# Nunavut Arctic College Assignment of Credit to Courses and Programs

#### **POLICY**

Nunavut Arctic College shall assign credit to courses that are part of Certificate and Diploma programs.

## **PRINCIPLES**

- 1. Nunavut Arctic College recognizes the need for credit to validate Certificate and Diploma programs.
- 2. The Nunavut Arctic College Document of Recognition for Certificate and Diploma programs is awarded based upon the successful completion of a required number of credit courses and related learning experiences.
- Nunavut Arctic College recognizes that the assignment of credits to a course is one part of the process which allows the college to enter into articulation agreements with other postsecondary institutions.

### **PROCEDURE**

- 1. Assignment of credit shall be on the basis of instructional contact hours with fifteen (15) hours equivalent to one (1) credit.
- 2. The College will grant credit in a Certificate / Diploma program to a student who successfully completes a standard 3 credit course which has 45 hours of delivery.
- 3. The College will grant a Nunavut Arctic College Certificate to a student who has completed a minimum of thirty [30] credits in a certificate level program or as otherwise stated in the Program outline.
- 4. The College will grant a Nunavut Arctic College Diploma to a student who has completed a minimum of sixty [60] credits to a maximum of ninety [90] credits in a diploma level program or as otherwise stated in the Program outline.
- 5. Any exception of #2 or #3 will be presented to the Nunavut Arctic College Board of Governors who will approve / reject the change. Exceptions will be stated in the Nunavut Arctic College Calendar and the Program outline.
