Nunavut Arctic College Consumption of Intoxicants Policy

POLICY

Alcohol, tobacco products and/or non-medical drugs or chemicals shall not be brought into or consumed in any of the College's facilities that are leased or owned; this includes academic buildings, single student residences, married student residences or common areas. Alcohol, tobacco products and/or non-medical drugs or chemicals shall not be brought into or consumed in any events hosted or organized by the College.

PRINCIPLES

- Nunavut Arctic College recognizes the importance of providing a drug, tobacco and alcohol free environment.
- The College supports its staff and students requesting assistance with substance abuse. Students will receive assistance through Student Services staff and may be referred to outside agencies as deemed necessary and appropriate. Staff requesting assistance will be referred to the GN Employee Assistance Program.

PROCEDURE

- 1. This policy applies to staff and students.
- All staff and students will be made aware of this policy and be required to comply. It is the responsibility of the Campus Dean to ensure that this policy and respective regulations are made known to the applicants.
- 3. Violations of the policy may result in progressive disciplinary measures. Certain violations may result in immediate termination from a program as well as residences.
- 4. Staff requesting assistance or advice on the treatment of substance abuse problems will be supported by the College and referred to the appropriate agencies for assistance.
- 5. Students requesting assistance will receive assistance through Student Services staff and will be referred to outside agencies as appropriate.
- Decisions regarding discipline will be made by the Campus Dean in consultation with the Senior Academic Officer and the senior official from Student Services at the respective campus.
- 7. Appeals may be made under Policy D.02 Appeals Student Behaviour Non-Academic.
