



QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS REGARDING COMPLETION OF THIS ACADEMIC YEAR.

1) WHAT SEMESTERS DOES THE COLLEGE HAVE?

The College currently has three semesters: Fall, Winter, and Spring. The Spring Semester will run from May 4th to Mid-June (dates to be finalized at a later date).

2) WHAT DOES AN EXTENDED SUSPENSION MEAN?

This means that the Winter Term (starting from January 6th to May 3rd) will not resume. The temporary suspension that began on March 18 **will continue to May 4.**

3) WHAT STEPS DO I NEED TO FOLLOW TO COMPLETE THIS SCHOOL YEAR?

Please contact your instructor or Dean for information to assist you in the completion of your program. Plans have been developed for each program.

4) WOULD I BE ABLE TO COMPLETE ANY ASSIGNMENTS OR EXAMS IN MY HOME COMMUNITY?

This option is being considered. More information will be available soon.

5) WOULD THE COMMUNITY LEARNING CENTRE BE OPEN TO SUPPORT ME?

At this time, the CLCs are closed, for the health and safety of staff, students and broader community.

6) IF I AM SUCCESSFUL IN COMPLETING ALL COURSE REQUIREMENTS, WILL I BE ELIGIBLE TO GO TO THE NEXT YEAR?

Yes.

7) WHEN WOULD I FIND OUT MY RESULTS FOR THIS YEAR?

Results should be available within a few weeks of the completion of the year.

8) IF I NEED TO STAY IN IQALUIT, WILL THE COLLEGE WAIVE ANY ADDITIONAL FEES FOR RESIDENCE?

The College will inform you of these requirements within the coming weeks. The College will work with funding agencies to ensure student eligibility for additional living allowances are communicated to students.



9) WILL I STILL GET FUNDING?

If your program will be resuming in the Spring Session, then you should still be eligible for funding.

The College recommends that students reach out to their specific funding organizations to get definitive answers on this.

10) WHAT ABOUT ACCOMMODATIONS?

If you are currently in Student Accommodation, you will have your room until your program is completed.

Program end dates are still being determined, and programs will reach out to their respective students to keep them updated on plans.

College students are asked to confirm their accommodation plans with their resident manager or Dean.

11) WHAT ABOUT TRAVEL?

If College students are currently away from home and wish to return home, that travel will be arranged for you. Again, the **College recommends that you reach out to your funding organization for clarification.**

College students are asked to confirm their travel plans with their resident manager, program manager or Dean.

12) WILL I HAVE TO TRAVEL BACK TO MY CAMPUS IN MAY?

Because the COVID-19 pandemic is constantly changing, the College cannot answer this question at this time; however, College Programs are working on the assumption that face to face classes will not be allowed, and are planning alternative ways to deliver the remaining course material for each specific program.

13) THE COLLEGE MENTIONS SOME ONLINE COMPONENTS? WHAT IF I DON'T HAVE INTERNET OR A COMPUTER?

The College is looking into options to support students who need IT support (including a computer and Internet). The College encourages its students to inform their instructors if they require a computer and/or internet.



14) ARE ALL PROGRAMS RESTARTING IN MAY?

The College is committed to doing all it can to ensure students complete the 2019/2020 academic year. The College anticipates that some programs will be restarting in May, and some may not. Again, each program will be working to connect with their students to explain what the future plans are.

15) WHAT IF MY PROGRAM DOESN'T START IN MAY?

Program Managers will be making a decision on what programs will/will not start up in May. Students will be informed of program decisions as soon as they become finalized.

16) WHEN WILL I GRADUATE?

The College anticipates convocations will occur in September 2020. This plan, will of course, depend on advice provided by Nunavut's Public Health Officer. The respective programs will work with students to keep them updated on graduation plans.

17) WILL I RECEIVE A CERTIFICATE/DIPLOMA/DEGREE?

Yes. Students who have graduated will receive a certificate, diploma or degree.

However, students who are in programs that are offered by semester will receive a mark based on work completed as of March 17, 2020.

18) WHAT ABOUT A GRADUATION CEREMONY?

Ceremonies for graduates of programs are still being reviewed. More information will be provided once available.

19) WHERE CAN I GET MORE INFORMATION ABOUT MY PROGRAMS' PLANS?

Please reach out to your instructors. They may not have immediate answers, but they will be working to get you information as soon as possible.

20) I AM A MEMBER OF THE COLLEGE'S STAFF OR FACULTY, WHAT DOES THIS NEWS MEAN TO ME?

The College is committed to ensuring its staff and faculty, like its students, are taken care of and informed. The College is working with its various program heads to develop a schedule for the upcoming term. The College will work closely with the Department of Human Resources and the Nunavut Employees Union, to ensure the College's plans are consistent with the Government of Nunavut. Details will become available as soon as they are finalized.
